

Dear fellow members,

I am very pleased to be addressing you for the first time in this issue of our Newsletter.

The new Board of officers began its 2-year term in May 2015. While a few of these volunteers are returning for another term, we have a few new people, particularly younger ones joining our ranks. We welcome those new Board members with open arms, as this gives us an opportunity to gain fresh ideas and viewpoints. Together with the experience of the "older" Board members, we have a great team to represent you, our members.

The business of the Chinese Business Chamber is important! Not only do we open opportunities for networking both locally and internationally, but we actively pursue initiatives to create business opportunities and leads, to assist you in the advancement of your businesses and professions. We have in place Agreements and Memoranda of Understanding with Chambers of Commerce in several countries including China, Malaysia, Madagascar, Reunion Island and Pakistan.

The Board has been busy since taking office this year. Between the months of August to September we had the pleasure of welcoming delegations to Mauritius from the Hunan Provincial People's Government, Xiangxi Prefecture and Chenzhou Municipal Council of China. After discussions, the delegates of all three missions expressed their wish to encourage members of their associations and cities to consider Mauritius either as a place in which to invest or as a platform for their African ventures. CBC has acted as an intermediary for a meeting between the Municipality of Beau Bassin-Rose Hill and the Xiangxi Prefecture. The two councils agreed to explore possibilities of mutual assistance and the promotion in trade and tourism with the assistance of CBC. We will keep members posted about any development, which might be of interest to them.

CBC in partnership with the Hua Lien Association held 2 talks for their members; the first one was on the Finance Bill in June 2015 and the second one on Smart Cities in August 2015. Both talks were very well attended by members of both associations as well as members of the South Africa Chamber of Commerce and the Chambre de Commerce d'Industrie de France a Maurice. The next talks we will hold will be on "Succession Planning" and "Engineering as a Career Choice". The dates will be communicated to you soon.

We also have good news for members whose children are thinking of going to Malaysia for their tertiary education next year. We have signed a partnership agreement with UCSI University in Malaysia who has offered scholarships for children of members. Subject to further negotiations, we wish to make this partnership a rolling one over several years for the benefits of our members' children. Let me also take the opportunity to brief you of some ongoing initiatives. Looking East from Mauritius, we have had discussions with the national trade promotion agency of Malaysia - Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation (MATRADE). They have agreed to keep us informed of their program of trade fairs both in Malaysia and within the region. They have now sent us an invitation to the Quick Win Trade Fair which will be held in Kuala Lumpur in Malaysia in November 2015 and for which delegates will be provided free accommodation for 3nights/4days on a first come first served basis. I encourage members to avail themselves of such an opportunity and to contact the CBC to confirm their interest. We are also talking to the Honorary Consul of South Korea for the same purpose of getting advance information on trade fairs, which will be held in South Korea.

Looking West from Mauritius, we are negotiating to sign a tri-chamber agreement with the South African Chamber of Commerce and the Chambre de Commerce et d'Industrie de France a Maurice. We will thus extend the networking opportunities for our members and have already participated in some of our mutual activities, such as conferences and talks.

CBC in collaboration with the BOI will form part of a delegation, which will visit Ghana next month. This is an initiative taken by the Minister of Finance following the visit of the President of Ghana earlier this year. This is an opportunity for members to participate in this mission to explore business opportunities in this vet- to be fully tapped market. You are requested to contact CBC to confirm your interest to join the delegation.

We are also in the final stages in the preparation of the printing of our biennial directory. A copy will be made available to all members, sponsors and Chambers of Commerce with whom we collaborate, by the end of the year.

One of our ongoing goals is to improve communication between CBC and our members. We will do this through new channels of communication via social media and the organization of informal get-togethers with the goal of reaching all the members over time.

CBC would not function without its volunteers. I strongly encourage you to learn more about CBC, its history and the services we provide for our members. Remember, communication is best achieved when it goes both ways. Your feedback and involvement in the Chamber's activities through assisting in the various committees would be most useful with a view to offer you a better service that would meet your expectations.

The Chinese Business Chamber in association with Hua Lien held its monthly talk on Thursday the 20th August 2015. The subject covered was Smart cities and Property development scheme. This topic is currently in the limelight as it is one of the main components of the Vision 2030 of Mauritius. The 2 distinguished guest speakers, Mr. Sachin Mohabeer and Mr. Gaëtan Siew gave to audience more insights about the topic.

The Smart City concept was first mentioned in the Budget 2015-2016, with a total of 8 cities to be built and Port-Louis to be revamped.





Smart Cities aim at being self-sustained cities dedicated to knowledge driven industries conciliating working, living and leisure space. Each city is to be led by a main theme, for example logistics and airport/port related activities, ocean led development and knowledge. Every project should be a large-scale mixed use development project that is environmentally friendly, can generate its own resources in terms of energy and water, provide for state of the art connectivity and smart modern transportation, promote the "live, work and play" concept and invest in dedicated space for the development for arts and culture. These cities are relied on to solve numerous challenges that Mauritius is currently facing, for example traffic congestion, unemployment, energy production and pollution and the decline of the contribution of the construction sector to our GDP.

The property development scheme (PDS) has been designed to facilitate the acquisition of residential property by non-citizens on the island. PDS provides for the development of a mix of high standing residential properties, leisure and Commercial amenities, day to day services such as security, maintenance, gardening, solid waste disposal and household services, social programmes and community projects under the PDS social fund. Some key features of PDS include, the land size (1-50 acres), 25% of the serviced land should be allocated to residential properties, 25% residential properties for Mauritians or member of Mauritian Diaspora, the granting of a residential permit for an acquisition of USD500,000 or more, the land per residential property is not to exceed 2,100m2 and there is no minimum selling price requirements.



* THE CHINA-AFRICA LEGAL PROFESSIONALS EXCHANGE PROJECT BY KATE LI KWONG WING

It was four weeks of complete immersion into the Chinese culture and legal system by way of lectures by eminent legal scholars and practitioners, and visits to the Supreme People's • Procuratorate and the Supreme People's Court, and exchanges with the Shanghai Bar Association and Shanghai Law Association, and the Shanghai International Arbitration Center.

> • The Chinese legal system is indeed a unique one, which has developed over only 30 years compared to some other jurisdictions which have • centuries of legal history. Historically, the Chinese legal system was • based on Confucianism, where ethical rules were primary social norms. After the Cultural Revolution in China in the 1970s, China had • only 2 laws, namely the Constitution and the law of marriage. There • was therefore an urgent need to reform its legal system, and with the opening up of China in 1978, China has started reforms in its laws and is still carrying out reforms.

> From a feudalistic country to one ruled by its people, China is now • embracing the concept of Rule of Law with Chinese characteristics. In • the 18th Congress of the National People's Congress (NPC), President Xi Jing Pin further confirmed the Party's intention to promote the rule • of law in China. In the 4th Planium Congress of the NPC, it has been • stated that China's path to developing its legal system is unique, and has several decades to catch up with western countries.

China has already embarked on a series of judicial reforms: China has amended its constitution at least 4 times, and has also incorporated many international laws in its local laws, and has acceded to international treaties. China now has more than 300 international treaties and signed 20,000 bilateral treaties which covers international trade. There are at least 7 branches of law in China, namely: constitution, civil and commercial, administrative, economic, social welfare and procedure law. It is expected that new branches of law will be established such as environmental and military and defence. Awareness of the rule of law is also being promoted in the general public.

The Program therefore offered a unique platform for exchanges and also a source of understanding of the socialist legal system with Chinese characteristics. The Program also allowed the participants to learn more about and compare the different legal systems in the various African jurisdictions they come from. Overall, I learnt first hand about the history of the Chinese legal system, and got a general overview on the various laws of China, including the criminal, employment, financial and economic laws of the country. The Program also allowed us to see the progress that China has done so far in its judicial reforms, and its challenges in coping with new developments in its society, such as progress in technology and social media.

Our visit to the Shanghai Bar Association and Shanghai Law Association and the high level interaction we had with them also demonstrated how China has advanced in respect of its laws. Shanghai has also established a Pilot Free Trade Zone, and a special arbitration court has even been set up to resolve financial and commercial disputes.

I come out of this Program with a better understanding of the Chinese legal system which will allow me to understand Chinese clients better and also help me understand issues from their perspectives.

CBC Visit to China



On March 18, 2015, the CBC sent a delegation to China on the invitation of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries. In the first leg, the CBC visited Beijing, Jinan, Changsha. The CBC was received by Vice-President Mme Lin Yi of the Association. During the bilateral meeting, trade and investment opportunities were explored with companies like Sinopharm, Aiguo, BYD Auto, Zhongda and Jingle. In addition the CBC visited the wholesale market of Linyi in Shangdong Province.

On the second leg, the CBC visited Shanghai at the invitation of the CPPCC Shanghai Committee and signed a Memoramdum of Understanding with them. The CBC was received by its Vice-Chairman Mr. Zhou Taitong. During the meeting, the CBC was briefed on a major initiative by the Government of China, entitled "One belt One Road", One Belt referring to the Silk Road from China to Europe and One Road referring to the 21st Century Maritime Silk Road. During the second leg, the CBC met with various companies from Shanghai interested in trade and investment opportunities in Mauritius and via Mauritius to Africa. The CBC also Visited the Shanghai Free Trade Zone.

Finally, the CBC visited the CCPIT (Chinese Council for the Promotion of International Trade) and Chamber of Commerce of the respective Provinces and Municipalities.

Zhangjiajie and Sangzhi (famous for its scenery) used to be part of the Prefecture and it consists of one city, Jishou and seven counties, Baojing, Fenghuang, Guzhang, Huayuan, Longshan, Luxi, Yongshun. There are 25 minorities in the Prefecture, with a population of 2.5M. Tujia and Miao are the largest minorities. It is a region rich in culture and scenic beauty.
